


ENABLING BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT

FLOURISHING BUSINESS SECTOR

The business sector in Baliwag continues to grow as shown in the upward trend in the number of registrations, total gross receipts, and total capitalization from 2013 to 2018. Majority of the businesses are engaged in wholesale and retail trading. The economic resiliency of Baliwag is ranked 10th in the country based on the National Competitiveness Index.

INVESTMENT **INCENTIVES**

As partners for development, the Municipal Government grants tax incentives to qualified enterprises based on the following schedule:



A SPECIAL INCENTIVE is also given to qualified enterprises, which are compliant with the Local Climate Change Action Plan and Green Air Act. Further, discounts are given to the top 10 paying enterprises supporting the sports development program of Baliwag through formation, assistance, and management of a sports team.

REVENUE MOBILIZATION AND **RESPONSIBLE FISCAL** MANAGEMENT

3 EASY STEPS OF BUSINESS REGISTRATION

STEP I: Register an account at www.baliwag.gov.ph.
STEP 2: Fill out online application form.
STEP 3: Visit the Municipal Hall to pay and claim permit and

Guaranteed one (I) day or one-and-half (I/2) days at most processing for new applications, while not more than one (I) day processing for business renewals, provided that all requirements are complied with by the applicants.

- Proof of business registration, incorporation, or legal personality; Basis for computing taxes, fees, and charges; Occupancy permit, if required by national (Building Code) and local laws; Contract of Lease (if Lessee); and

STRATEGIC LOCATION & ACCESIBILITY

- A natural eye-candy for investors and business enthusiasts given the proximity and accessibility to Metro Manila and the rest of the provinces in North Luzon. Baliwag is about 52 kilometers north of Manila, which translates to only one (I) hour travel time.
- Accessibility to domestic and international airports and seaport: 60 km away from the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA-Pasay City), 55 km away from the Clark International Airport (Pampanga) and 119 km away from Subic International Airport (Zambales), and 52 km away from seaport or public wharf in Manila.

Has three (3) major transport lines such as Baliwag-Candaba (Benigno S. Aquino Avenue) road going to Pampanga, and the Old Cagayan Valley road (Calle Rizal) and the Dona Remedios Trinidad Highway (Daang Maharlika) going to Manila and Nueva Ecija.

• Serves as a transportation hub that facilitates the movements of goods and passengers to and from the provinces of Pampanga and Nueva Ecija and Metro Manila. It hosts the Baliwag Transit, Inc., one of the biggest transportation companies in Luzon.
